

**Minutes of the Meeting
July 9, 2002
at Quarters Restaurant**

The meeting was called to order with President Ken Rice welcoming back some old members and new. Mr. Rice noted that the most important issue on tonight's agenda was our upcoming trip to Black Bear Pass.

Mr. Rice mentioned the meeting minutes from June and ask that they be approved. Minutes approved.

On to the Colorado trip. Todd Pfortmiller mentioned that he had noticed some 14 channel 2 way radios for sale at the Smith grocery stores for a nominal fee of \$10. It was decided that radios would be purchased for the Colorado trip. (Note: several members went ahead and purchased the radios, so that for most events their should be sufficient radios for the activity). Mike and Susan went over the outline of our trip with our meeting at 8am on Friday and that a dinner was scheduled for the group in Ouray that night.

Susan verified cell phone numbers and an official vehicle count was taken with a total of nine vehicles making the trip.

On to new business - the August activity has not been decided due to the club still trying

to schedule an outing with the BLM. Suzanne Miller said that she would have an activity on the schedule by August's meeting.

Mike Robertson mentioned the newsletter that the deadline for articles is July 21, 2002. He also mentioned that several members had volunteered articles for the upcoming newsletter which will be out July 21, 2002.
